Due to the decrease in production we expect the effects on the local environment to be minimal. All annual sampling exercises over the last few years have shown no breaches to the emissions targets set. The current permit requires us to check the boundary of our site for stack inspections of smoke and odour and we have had no recorded issues that have breached the conditions of the permit.
